## Dean's Research Incentive Course Release (DRICR)

The purpose of this program is to provide faculty members with time in which to design and write a high-quality grant proposal. This program provides one course release for one semester. During this time, the faculty member will write a proposal to submit to a research grant competition run by a foundation, federal agency, or other sponsor. The DRICR will fund the development of large and complex proposals. In 2022-23, the Dean's office will select up to two recipients of the DRICR for a course release in the 2022-23 academic year. Faculty who already have a course release for 2022-23 are not eligible for this award.

## Deliverables:

By the conclusion of the semester of the course release, the DRICR recipient will submit:

- 1) A full draft of the proposal that aligns with the specifications of the target sponsor and competition.
- 2) A plan for completing and submitting the full application package by the competition due date.

## Application:

Please submit an application that includes 1) a narrative responding to the following questions and 2) a CV.

In no longer than 1000 words:

- 1) Provide a tentative description of the study you intend to propose, the problem it addresses, and how its findings will advance its particular field.
- 2) Identify the target sponsor and competition for this proposal. *Competition due date must be no later than September 1, 2023.* Explain why your proposal will be well-suited to this sponsor and competition.
- 3) What have you already accomplished in preparing to submit this grant proposal?
- 4) How would you use the course buyout to develop your proposal?
- 5) Present a timeline of action steps from the start of the semester in which you propose to take the course release to the date of the final proposal submission to the sponsor.
- 6) Have you communicated with your department head regarding your interest in obtaining this course buyout?
